## What is Religious Studies?

Religious Studies is about finding out what people believe and why.

It looks at the ultimate and big questions of life such as:

What is the meaning of life? What happens to us after we die?

Is there a being in charge of everything or has everything come about randomly?

We explore a range of beliefs to these questions and reflect on the debates between scientific approaches and religious approaches.

Do scientific developments make religious views out of date?

We explore why religious views state their viewpoints are not out-dated.



#### WHAT IS RELIGIOUS STUDIES GCSE?

We will also explore and consider some of the fundamental ethical issues that matter to us and to our place in society.

#### Issues such as:

- Crime and punishment and our legal systems
- Life issues such as abortion and euthanasia
- Attitudes to marriage and family and our place in society
- Attitudes to peace and conflict in the world today

We explore how beliefs may affect lifestyles and the actions people may choose to do.

Does your character matter? What if this is your only life? Do we have duties to others?




## WHAT WILL RELIGIOUS STUDIES GCSE DO FOR YOU?


Religious Studies will help develop your key skills in communication, working with others, problem solving and improving your own learning. It will also give you skills in making decisions about moral problems, and help you to become sure about your own beliefs and explain them clearly to others. It is not about making you religious, it is about enabling you to think for yourself about religious and moral issues. You do not need a 'faith' to enjoy this course - atheists are just as welcome as curious believers.

A GCSE in Religious Studies is a stepping stone to a wide range of future opportunities.

The skills you develop will support you in further studies and employment. Religious Studies will teach the skills and understanding needed to work with people of all faiths and cultures. These skills are vitally important in all careers especially professions such as law enforcement, teaching and the armed forces - in fact any profession that brings you into contact with other people. Students studying Religious Studies will develop their ability to construct well-argued, well-informed, balanced and structured written arguments as well as encourage them to reflect on and develop their own values, beliefs and attitudes. It equips students with the essential tools and qualities to enable them to function both effectively and efficiently as responsible, broad-minded citizens in an increasingly pluralistic society and global community.

- Akhirah: Muslim teachings about life after death




#### Section 4 - Peace & Conflict
